



DANGEROUS GOODS ROAD TRANSPORTATION POLICY

POLICY

APD Parcel Delivery Pty Ltd (APD) only provides confined service for the carriage of dangerous goods by road transport. APD will only accept and transport certain dangerous goods (DGs) listed in the Australian Dangerous Goods (ADG) Code 7.3 that are:

- Eligible for transportation within a Retail Distribution Load [ADG Code Chapter 7.3];
- Packed as Dangerous Goods Packed in Limited Quantity [ADG Code Chapter 3.4].
- Dangerous Goods Road Transport Shipping Documentation [ADG Code Chapter 11.1].

ACCEPTANCE CRITERIA

The acceptance criteria applied in accepting dangerous goods from APD customers for transportation are defined in the APD Customer Disclaimer, Section 12 Terms and Conditions of Cartage.

Prohibited dangerous goods are identified as, and shall include:

- Packing Group I
- Division 4.1, Spontaneously combustible substances
- Packagings that are shrink- or stretch-wrapped trays
- 4.3, Substances which in contact with water emit flammable gases
- Division 2.3, Toxic gases
- Division 6.2, Infectious substances
- Division 4.1, Flammable solids
- Division 5.2, Organic peroxides
- Division 6.1, Toxic substances
- Class 8, Corrosive substances

Fundamentally prohibited dangerous goods, shall include

- Class 1, Explosives
- Class 7, Radioactive materials

Conditionally allowable dangerous goods, shall include:

- Division 2.1, Flammable gases
- Division 2.2, Non-flammable, non-toxic gases
- Class 3, Flammable liquids
- Division 5.1, Oxidizing substances
- Class 9, Miscellaneous dangerous goods

These conditionally allowable dangerous goods are further restricted and / or limited to:

- a. Certain UN Numbers; and
- b. Being packed as 'dangerous goods packed in limited quantities' [LQs]; and
- c. The nature of their intended use.

Only dangerous goods conforming to this criterion shall be accepted from APD customers for transport.
